RESOLUTION NO. 2013-107

A RESOLUTION OF THE MOHAVE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OBJECTING TO THE INTRODUCTION OF THE MEXICAN WOLF (CANIS LUPUS BAILLEY) BY THE U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICES, A BUREAU IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, INTO MOHAVE COUNTY, ARIZONA.

WHEREAS, the presence of dangerous predators in Mohave County or surrounding counties and states whether introduced, or an experimental and managed species, will increase the potential for human-predator encounters; and

WHEREAS, the introduction of the Mexican Wolf (Canis Lupus Bailley) will be detrimental to the county's wildlife, recreation, ranching and our resident's and visitor's quality of life; and

WHEREAS, Mohave County disputes the claim that the introduction of the Mexican Wolf will not substantially impact affected counties or affect public safety and emergency services; and

WHEREAS, Mohave County is committed to protecting our citizens, wildlife, livestock, domesticated animals, and natural resources which are subject to degradation from the introduction of a predator species.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mohave County Board of Supervisors does hereby object to the introduction of the Mexican Wolf (Canis Lupus Bailley) by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services into Mohave County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be forwarded to Congress to urge them to eliminate any federal funding dedicated to this effort.
